APPROVE MINUTES FROM APRIL 27, 2020 MEETING

Chairman Lowell Moore asked if there were any additions or corrections to the minutes from April 27, 2020, regular meeting. With no corrections noted, Dennis Fitzpatrick made a motion to accept the minutes as presented. Joel Thierstein seconded the motion. The motion passed unanimously.

Agenda Item 6

CHAIRMAN’S REPORT

Chairman Moore stated he had no updates to provide.

Agenda 7

REGION VII OPERATIONS

Shane noted that the Region VII staff is continuing to work from home. He stated that the project's responsibilities are getting done with no issues. He mentioned that we are transitioning to a cloud-based system using Office 365 and would no longer use the server. Shane noted that Region VII staff would probably continue to work from home until June 30, 2020, at that time a decision would be made how and when we would return to the office full time.

Agenda Item 8

EDA COVID-19 PLANNING GRANT

Shane reported that Region VII would be getting additional planning grant funds from the US Economic Development Administration as a result of Covid-19. This will be a two-year non-competitive grant, the first year would be for \$200,000 and the second year would be another \$200,000. There is no match required for this grant; however, we do have to complete and submit an application. The application is due the first week of June 2020. US EDA presented a statement of work identifying the eligible activities that can be completed with these additional planning funds. These funds will be used for technical assistance, updating our CEDS and assisting our communities in recovering from the pandemic.

Agenda Item 9

DISCUSSION AND APPROVAL OF FY2021 BUDGET

Shane presented the proposed revenues for FY2021. As previously mentioned, Shane made note that an overall increase in revenues will take place for FY2021 due to the fact that we will be receiving an additional \$200,000 from US EDA. All other revenues will remain the same, or close to, years past. No other significant changes are expected other than the completion of our ARC GIS Planning Grant. Total proposed revenues for FY2021 is estimated to be \$912,500.00.

Cam presented the proposed expenses for FY2021. The increase in the personnel and fringe benefits line items is due to the standard employee pay increase that is being proposed by Shane for the staff. In looking at the expense line items; the largest increase will be due to the EDA COVID-19 grant expenses. The contractual line item as well as the meeting line item will increase due to updating the CEDS. Computer hardware and software will increase anticipating the need to upgrade technology to allow the staff to continue to telework during pandemics. The IT services will increase to cover the additional equipment that the staff will have at home. The pass-through grant expense is directly related to the EDA COVID-19 grant and potential workforce development to combat the economic issues that we are having. Miscellaneous will be a major increase as it is a place holder for items that will be a result of the EDA COVID-19 grant.

A motion was made by Dennis Fitzpatrick to approve the FY2021 budget, Dennis Filler seconded the motion. The motion was passed unanimously.
